



KULIN MELBOURNE: SITES OF INDIGENOUS SIGNIFICANCE

This map was first developed in 2017 and was intended as a starting point to recognise just some of the many sites of Indigenous significance found across Kulin Melbourne, and is by no means a complete list. The highlighted locations include sites of intangible cultural heritage, contemporary Indigenous architecture and design, commemorative markers, local Aboriginal organisations and important historic and political sites. It represents the past, present and future of Kulin Melbourne.

The map has been developed in a continuing partnership between Open House Melbourne, the Koorie Heritage Trust, and Indigenous Architecture and Design Victoria. The sites have been selected by Jefa Greenaway, and the map designed by Letoya Muraru. We acknowledge the Traditional Custodians of the land that this map represents, the peoples of the Kulin Nation, and pay our respects to their Elders, past, present and future. This land was never ceded. This map of Kulin Melbourne demonstrates the ongoing connection of our Indigenous communities to land and place that existed before invasion and continues today.

Kulin Nation Gathering Place Melbourne Cricket Ground

- An important historical gathering place for the people of the Kulin Nation, it sits on what is now known as the grounds of the Melbourne Cricket Ground (MCG). Scar trees can also be found in the adjacent Yarra Park, demonstrating an ongoing Aboriginal occupation of the land.
- The Black Mile Gertrude Street, Fitzroy From Nicholson Street to Smith Street this stretch of Gertrude Street has been home to community services and sites of political activism for the
- Aboriginal people of Victoria. You Are, Here Now Australian Catholic University Façade Corner of Brunswick Street and Victoria Parade, Fitzroy. You Are, Here Now, 2015-a commissioned artwork by artist Megan Cope paying homage to the landscape of Yalukit Willam and the Aboriginal people of the Port Phillip area.
- Pastor Sir Douglas + Lady Gladys Nicholls Memorial Spring Street, Parliament Gardens, Melbourne A memorial of two of Australia's most prominent Indigenous Leaders.
- The Moreton Bay Fig Tree Carlton Gardens, Nicholson Street, Carlton
- When bans were enforced on political meetings from the 1920s-1940s this site became a meeting place for the emerging Aboriginal community in Fitzrov Bunjilaka Aboriginal Cultural Centre (Melbourne Museum)
- Carlton Gardens, Carlton Bunjilaka is an Aboriginal cultural centre and keeping place of Aboriginal artefacts. The First People's exhibit that opened in 2013 is a co-curated space between Indigenous Elders and Indigenous Museum Victoria staff.

- Lowitja Institute 100 Drummond St, Carlton
- Australia's National Institute for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander
- Standing by Tunnerminnerwait and Maulboyheenner A commemorative marker Corner Victoria & Franklin Streets, Melbourne
- A commemorative public marker commissioned by artists Brook Andrew and Trent Walker to mark the site where two Aboriginal Tasmanians. unnerminnerwait and Maulboyheenner, became the first people to be publicly executed in Melbourne in 1842.
- The William Barak Building 551 Swanston Street, Carlton An apartment tower designed by ARM Architecture. The building's
- facade features the face of important Wurundjeri leader William Barak, which received a mixed public opinion when opening in 2015. Ngarara Place (RMIT University) Chemistry Lane, RMIT University, Melbourne Indigenous designed landscape/intervention, building a visible presence and recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples at RMIT
- Pre-Colonial Red-River Gums Near University Oval, College Crescent, University of Melbourne, Parkville The University of Melbourne is home to Red-River gums dating from
- before European invasion. This surviving landscape invokes imagery of what Kulin Melbourne looked like pre-invasion The Koorie Heritage Trust
- Yarra Building, Federation Square, Melbourne

The Koorie Heritage Trust is a community owned and run Indigenous gallery and cultural centre celebrating the continuing journey of the Aboriginal Peoples of South Eastern Australia. The building interior was designed by Lyons Architecture with Greenaway Architects and Indigenous Architecture and Design Victoria to reflect Koorie design

Birrarung Wilam (campsite on the river of mists) Birrarung Marr, along the Yarra River behind Federation Square A ground breaking design and interactive installation that re-creates a place of gathering along the Birrarung. This site was created as a place to acknowledge and commemorate all Victorian Aboriginal communities and language groups. The Wilin Garden (The Wilin Centre for Indigenous

Arts and Cultural Development) University of Melbourne, 234 St Kilda Rd, Southbank

commemorates the site of the first settler graves whilst staying silent on

- An Indigenous garden located outside of the Wilin Centre, within the Faculty of the VCA and MCM at the University of Melbourne. This site is a significant contemporary gathering place for the Wilin Centre ndigenous students and staff. Aboriginal Remains Buried within the historic cemetery beneath the Queen Victoria Market, Corner Franklin & William Streets, Melbourne This is the site of Melbourne's first official colonial cemetery from 1837-1854, which had a section allocated for Aboriginal remains. It has since become part of the Queen Victoria Market, leaving thousands of marked remains still buried beneath the car park Aboriginal Remains (Pre-Invasion Aboriginal Burial Ground) lagstaff Gardens, Melbourne Pre-invasion Aboriginal burial site that now contemporarily
- the Indigenous history of the site. Aboriginal Remains (Reburial site of repatriated Aboriginal remains) Kings Domain, Melbourne The Kings Domain resting place holds the remains of 38 Victorian Aboriginal people who were repatriated to the community in 1985 from Museum Victoria, in proceedings led by Uncle Jim Berg, the founder of the Koorie Heritage Trust.

SELECTED BUILDINGS



Comprising a prominent block in Melbourne's CBD, this development demonstrates how an under-utilized part of the city can be transformed into a vibrant urban community. It greatly expands the network of public spaces and reinforces the city's link with the Yarra River. Anchoring the site is a pair of tapered 164-meter towers connected by an elevated sky bridge. Explore the city's latest vertical village during the OHM Weekend, with architect-led tours by the Woods Bagot.



Take a tour of the new Pride Centre-Australia's first LGBTIQ+ purpose-built centre designed to bring the LGBTIQ+ community together as a cultural, social and services hub. Designed by BAU and Grant Amon Architects, the Pride Centre offers an open door to the whole community who share their values of equality, diversity and inclusivity. These tours will be the first look into the new Pride Centre, connecting the diverse parts of the LGBTIQ+ community and providing a vital link with the general community.



Encompassing locations including Brunswick Town Hall, Mechanics Institute, Site Works and more, the BDD connects people, places and partnerships to support and strengthen Melbourne's creative community. The OHM tours invite the wider community into spaces not normally open to the public, as well as the opportunity to meet the practitioners within their working spaces. while enhancing health and wellbeing.



A culturally rich and much-loved civic building, the Town Hall Broadmeadows celebrates its past and present. Kerstin Thompson Architects' skilful adaptivereuse design puts form to the building's memories. 

Designed by acclaimed architectural firms Woods Bagot and layball, the 75,800sqm precinct boasts smart and sustainable design including on-site rainwater harvesting as well as solar and geothermal energy.



A contemporary mosque that moves away from the traditional forms of Islamic architecture, the Australian Islamic *Centre* is a comprehensive complex with worship, educational and recreational facilities. The community-funded building was designed by Pritzker Architecture Prize-winning architect Glenn Murcutt in collaboration with Hakan Elevli of Elevli+Architects. The building features 96 gold-painted lanterns installed on the roof that direct red, green and blue triangular light into the spaces below. Each colour represents different aspects of the Islamic faith. Guided tours will run throughout the OHM Weekend led by Hakan Elevli and the AIC community.

Open House Melbourne are partnering Living Cities Forum and ACMI to present a satellite program of four films that speak to the Forum's 2021 theme, *The Long View*—a theme that asks how different perspectives on time can affect the growth of our cities. The films will be screening from Thursday 22 July to Tuesday 3 August at ACMI. The annual Heritage Address is a lecture presented by the Heritage Council of Victoria, Archaeologist and Heritage Council member Meg Goulding, and Jeremy Smith, Heritage Victoria's Principal Archaeologist present new discoveries from some of the city's recent archaeological investigations. The results of these digs enhance Melbourne's reputation as one of the world's best examples of a 19th century archaeological site, and throw new light
